This product is designed and manufactured to operate within defined design limits, and misuse may result in electric shock or fire. Opening the Package

The SCEPTRE display is packaged in a carton. The size and weight of the product might be too heavy for 1 person to handle. In the event of that happening, it is recommended that the display package must be handled by a minimum of 2 or more persons. Since the glass can be easily scratched or broken, please handle the product gently. Never place the unit on a surface with the glass facing downwards unless it is on a protective padding. When opening the carton, check that the product is in good condition and that all standard accessories and items are included. Save the original box and all packing materials for future shipping needs.



Installation

Please read the user manual carefully before performing the installation. When an extension cord is required, use one with the correct power rating. Use only the Sceptre-provided power cable or AC adapter approved for use with this device. The product should be installed on a flat surface to avoid tipping. Space should be maintained between the back of the product and the wall for proper ventilation. Avoid installing the product in the kitchen, bathroom, or other places with high humidity, dust, or smoke, so as not to shorten the service life of the electronic components. Please ensure the product is installed with the screen in landscape orientation. Any 90° clockwise or counterclockwise installation may induce poor ventilation and subsequent component damage.

Installing the Monitor Stand Assembly

1. Take the monitor with packing foam out of the box. Lay the monitor screen facing down on a table with the monitor still resting on the packing foam. Obtain the display base and attach it to the display neck. While the neck is attached to the base, insert, and tighten 2 base screws to the bottom of the base. Insert the rubber cover to the back of the neck.



2. Install the assembled stand to the back of the monitor and screw in the 2 neck screws to secure the stand to the monitor.




3. Insert the rubber cover to the back of the neck.
4. To finalize your installation of the display, please read the following:
 - a. If you are placing the display on a stand, we would recommend using a display safety strap (not included) to minimize the possibility of the display toppling over.
 - b. Securely install all screws and connections.

Wall Mounting

1. To uninstall the stand assembly, lay the monitor facing downwards on a table. Remove the rubber cover and unscrew the two screws to remove the stand.



2. With the circular indentation now open to you, you will see 4 screws installed on the back of the monitor. Please unscrew them.
3. Install the wall mount plate to the back of the monitor using the provided **Wall Mount Plate Screws (M4 x 10mm)**.



4. Once the wall mount plate is installed, the monitor is ready to be wall mounted. **The mounting pattern is 100mm x 100mm.**

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
Identifying Front and Rear Panel

Front View



Indicator Light – The light is blue when the monitor is turned on. The light is red when the monitor is turned off but plugged into power. The light is flashing blue when there is no signal given to the monitor.

Rear View



The stand covers the mounting holes. Once you remove the stand, you will need to attach a mounting plate to wall mount the monitor. The mounting pattern is 100mm x 100mm using M4 x 10mm screws.


Front View with Buttons



Buttons from left to right

1. **M** – This button activates the On-Screen Display (OSD). While the OSD is active, this button will act as the select button to open up an option for adjustment.
2. **▲** – With no OSD, this button opens the Volume OSD and increases the monitor's volume output. With the OSD turned on, this button moves the selection upwards. This button will also increase the value of an adjustment while an option is open.
3. **▼** – With no OSD, this button opens the Volume OSD and decreases the monitor's volume output. With the OSD turned on, this button moves the selection downwards. This button will also decrease the value of an adjustment while an option is open.
4. **E** – When the OSD is active, this button acts as the EXIT button and exits out of the option or OSD. This button switches between all the different inputs of the display.
5. **⏻** – This button turns the display on or off.

Panel Tilt Adjustment




The screen can be adjusted by inclining forward and backward; however, the specific adjustment depends on the particular model of the device. Generally, it may be inclined $5^{\circ}\pm 1^{\circ}$ forward and $15^{\circ}\pm 2^{\circ}$ backward.

Please Note:

- When adjusting the angle of the monitor, be sure not to touch or press the LCD screen.

Rear View with Connections




1. **POWER** – This plug is responsible for providing power to the monitor. Use it with the included AC adapter.
2. **HDMI 1-3** – HDMI stands for High-Definition Multimedia Interface. This connection is for computers with HDMI video and audio output. HDMI1 is v2.0. HDMI2 and 3 are both HDMI v1.4.
3. **DISPLAYPORT** – DisplayPort is a digital video connection for connection to computers with display port video and audio output. DisplayPort is DP v1.2a.
4. **AUDIO OUT (3.5mm Mini-jack)** – This connection is for audio out from the monitor to multimedia speakers or headphones.

Please Note:

- HDMI1 at native resolution 1920 x 1080 will support 165Hz (HDMI 2 and HDMI3 support 144Hz) .
- DP at native resolution 1920 x 1080 will support 165Hz.
- To remove the DP cable from the monitor, you need to depress the buckle on the cable while unplugging.





On Screen Display (OSD) Menu

When you press the **M** button on the monitor, the OSD screen will appear. Select each of the functions with the **▲** or **▼** buttons. Use the **M** button again to enter each of the functions, or when you are in the function already, use the **M** button to select the option you want to adjust. Use the **▲** or **▼** buttons to adjust each option's values. When you want to exit, press the **E** button.



1. **TEMPERATURE** – This option lets users select different color temperatures of the monitor.
 - a. **NORMAL** – This color temperature is for users who prefer a neutral white balance.



How do I detach the DisplayPort Cable?

To detach the DP cable from the monitor, press down on the cables unlocking button while pulling the cable out.



How do I clean the monitor?

IMPORTANT

1. The power cable has to be removed from the socket before cleaning the display.
2. Do not use a volatile solvent (alcohol, rosin, and toluene) to clean the display. These types of chemicals might damage the housing and the LCD glass.

Cleaning the bezel

1. Use a 100% cotton cloth or micro-fiber cloth for cleaning.
2. If the bezel is dirty to the point where you cannot simply dry wipe it, please lightly dampen the wiping material with clean water and wipe again. Wipe the display with a dry microfiber cloth or 100% cotton cloth afterward.
