



Opening the Package

The SCEPTRE display is packaged in a carton. The size and weight of the product might be too heavy for 1 person to handle. In the event of that happening, it is recommended that the display package must be handled by a minimum of 2 or more persons. Since the glass can be easily scratched or broken, please handle the product gently. Never place the unit on a surface with the glass facing downwards unless it is on a protective padding. When opening the carton, check that the product is in good condition and that all standard accessories and items are included. Save the original box and all packing materials for future shipping needs.

Installation

Please read the user manual carefully before performing the installation. When an extension cord is required, use one with the correct power rating. Use only the Sceptreprovided power cable or AC adapter approved for use with this device. The product should be installed on a flat surface to avoid tipping. Space should be maintained between the back of the product and the wall for proper ventilation. Avoid installing the product in the kitchen, bathroom, or other places with high humidity, dust, or smoke, so as not to shorten the service life of the electronic components. Please ensure the product is installed with the screen in landscape orientation. Any 90° clockwise or counterclockwise installation may induce poor ventilation and subsequent component damage.

Installing the Monitor Stand Assembly

1. Insert the neck into the base with the front of the neck facing the left at 45-degree angle and twice the neck clockwise until you hear a click sound and the neck is facing forward aligned with the base. While the neck is attached to the base, insert, and tighten 1 base screws to the bottom of the base.



2. Install the assembled stand to the back of the monitor and screw in the 2 neck screws to secure the stand to the monitor.




- 3. Insert the rubber cover to the back of the neck.
- 4. To finalize your installation of the display, please read the following:
 - a. If you are placing the display on a stand, we would recommend using a display safety strap (not included) to minimize the possibility of the display toppling over.
 - b. Securely install all screws and connections.

Wall Mounting

1. To uninstall the stand assembly, lay the monitor facing downwards on a table. Remove the rubber cover and unscrew the two screws to remove the stand.



- 2. With the circular indentation now open to you, you will see 4 screws installed on the back of the monitor. Please unscrew them.
- 3. Install the wall mount plate to the back of the monitor using the provided Wall Mount Plate Screws (M4 x 10mm).



4. Once the wall mount spacer screws are installed, the monitor is ready to be wall mounted. **The mounting pattern is 100mm x 100mm.**

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
Identifying Front and Rear Panel

Front View



Indicator Light – The light is blue when the monitor is turned on. The light is red when the monitor is turned off but plugged into power. The light is flashing blue when there is no signal given to the monitor.

Rear View



The stand covers the mounting holes. Once you remove the stand, you will need to attach a mounting plate to wall mount the monitor. The mounting pattern is 100 mm x 100 mm using M4 x 10 mm screws.

Front View with Buttons



Buttons from left to right

- 1. **M** This button activates the On-Screen Display (OSD). While the OSD is active, this button will act as the select button to open up an option for adjustment.
- ▲ With no OSD, this button opens the Volume OSD and increases the monitor's volume output. With the OSD turned on, this button moves the selection upwards. This button will also increase the value of an adjustment while an option is open.
- 3. ▼ With no OSD, this button opens the Volume OSD and decreases the monitor's volume output. With the OSD turned on, this button moves the selection downwards. This button will also decrease the value of an adjustment while an option is open.
- E When the OSD is active, this button acts as the EXIT button and exits out of the option or OSD. This button switches between all the different inputs of the display.
- 5. \mathbf{U}_{-} This button turns the display on or off.

Panel Tilt Adjustment




The screen can be adjusted by inclining forward and backward; however, the specific adjustment depends on the particular model of the device. Generally, it may be inclined $5^{\circ}\pm1^{\circ}$ forward and $15^{\circ}\pm2^{\circ}$ backward.

Please Note:

• When adjusting the angle of the monitor, be sure not to touch or press the LCD screen.

Rear View with Connections



- 1. **HDMI 2** HDMI stands for High-Definition Multimedia Interface. This connection is for computers with HDMI video output.
- 2. **HDMI 1** HDMI stands for High-Definition Multimedia Interface. This connection is for computers with HDMI video output.
- 3. **VGA** VGA stands for Video Graphics Array. This connection is for computers to send video signals to the monitor by an analog signal. This method of connection is the most commonly used connection.
- 4. **AUDIO IN** This connection is for audio in from the computer going into the monitor. This connection is used with VGA.
- 5. **AUDIO OUT** This connection is for audio out from the monitor going out to either a speaker or headphone.
- 6. **DC IN** This connection is for electricity supplied from the included power adapter.




- 1. Make sure the power of the C24 LED MONITOR is turned off.
- 2. Obtain an HDMI cable and connect one end to the back of the monitor and the other end to the back of the computer.
- 3. For audio, you can plug in a set of headphones or speakers into the headphone jack.
- 4. Turn on the power of both the C24 LED MONITOR and the computer.

If You have VGA Connection on Your Video Card...



- 1. Make sure the power of C24 LED MONITOR is turned off.
- 2. If you were previously using a CRT (bulky) monitor, please hook up your old monitor first and make sure your refresh rate is set to 60Hz frequency before using the C24 LED MONITOR. You can find the refresh rate information and change it by RIGHT CLICKING on the desktop with nothing selected. After you have right clicked, select the DISPLAY SETTINGS option. Scroll to the bottom of the page and click on the DISPLAY ADAPTER PROPERTIES. Click on the MONITOR tab. In that tab, change the refresh rate to 60Hz and click on APPLY. After the refresh rate changed, please shut down the computer and monitor.
- 3. Obtain the VGA cable and connect to the VGA connection on your PC. Connect the other end of the cable to your C24 LED MONITOR.
- 4. Obtain a 3.5mm mini-jack cable connect it between the computer's audio out and the monitor's audio in.
- 5. Turn on the power of both the C24 LED MONITOR and the PC.


On Screen Display (OSD) Menu


